SR MARY BATCHELOR - 26 YEARS IN AFRICA

Dear "Keeping in Touch" readers,
As my 26 years in Africa come to an end (7 in South Africa and 19 in South Sudan), I look back in time and I marvel once again at the incredible generosity of so many wonderful Australians who have kept our missions afloat during all these years.

I went to South Africa in 1989 during the apartheid system of government into a mission already established by the Irish OLSH sisters, with whom I worked for many happy years. But my arrival in South Sudan was a different story altogether - this time at the height of a civil war, with next to no infrastructure at all in place in the country.

Over the years Sr Moira's mud brick clinic developed into a hospital, and the education system took shape. Our bamboo classrooms have given way to permanent buildings, and the secondary school, begun in dire poverty to keep our boys out of the army, is now well equipped, well staffed, and still developing. Teacher training is ongoing, and creates a problem in itself, as the government does not pay replacements when teachers are released for training - an added burden on us. Girls'

education is on the increase and we are in the process of improving hostel accommodation for girls coming from a distance away. The OLSH community in Mapuordit now consists of two Australians, two Indonesians and one from Papua New Guinea. The need is greater than ever with renewed tribal warfare, wide spread hunger and destruction of so much of what has been achieved in the country. As always the poor are the ones who suffer most. In conclusion I thank you once again for the many happy years of our partnership and

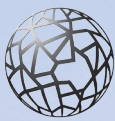

Due to the rigid austerity budget imposed by the government in South Sudan, the only way for the Mapuordit Hospital to retain their newly qualified staff is to offer them private contracts. Bakhita Village – Dwars River South Africa

Orphaned and vulnerable girls rely on Bakhita Village as a place of safety and an opportunity to be educated. Recent projects from Overseas Aid have funded transport costs to get the girls to school – it is several kilometres away. Our aid also funds cultural excursions and other educational costs such as uniforms and fees. We also provide opportunities for the carers of these girls to further their training and development.

OLSH School Covered Assembly Area, Cebu, Philippines

Since the OLSH School opened in Cordova, Cebu in 2007 there has been a need for a covered area for assemblies and other activities. Overseas Aid funds were used to purchase materials such as cement, metal bars and nails as well as for labour costs. The realization of this project means the students will be sheltered from the rain, leading to more comfort and convenience for all. The students will use the area for many activities, including parent assemblies, and parents will become more involved in helping the school as they see the improved conditions. It will benefit all the school community.
